MINISTER'S MESSAGE FROM DAVE'S DESK

The parish is in the process of updating our list of members who are on the prayer chain, that together we can send the power of prayer in numbers to someone who is ill, in trouble, or hurting. I've personally seen examples within the parish and outside the parish, when the life of the person being prayed for looked grim or maybe even hopeless. I've also seen some of these people recover with no logical explanation from the doctor. Prayer is powerful, especially when many come together in prayer. I'd like to share a story by Tony Campolo, a well-known Christian writer that tells about how we pray.

Tony Campolo was once a guest speaker at a mission rally, when he was asked to lead in prayer for a missionary doctor that the group supported. The goal of the prayer? That God might provide \$5000 that was urgently needed for the medical center that the doctor ran.

Tony refused. He knew his audience was made up of people who were materially prosperous. So, he declared he would pray only after everyone in the room gave to the project the money they had in their pockets that day. The audience was stunned, but when Tony began emptying his pockets, they knew he was serious. After some hesitation, everyone started following suit. The prayer of request soon became a prayer of thanksgiving, because by the end of the giving, they had collected \$8000, much more than was needed in the first place.

This true story was an example of taking it to the Lord in prayer, when in fact the Lord had already provided it. For those at the mission rally who were asking for God to provide, they soon found out that he already did, in the form of pocket change for those in attendance, totaling \$8000.

We can and should pray for those who are in need of prayer, but sometimes there's more we can do. I'm sure you've heard the saying that God helps those who help themselves. Often the answer to our prayers is right in front of us, especially when what we give to the situation was given to us by God in the first place. Quite often, we can also help those in need with a call, a card, a visit, a meal or even financial help if we are able, and then keep them in prayer daily until their time of need has passed and prayers are answered. Drinking and Boating

With the summer months in Minnesota comes boating, fishing, BBQing, and many other water activities. We spend too much time indoors during the winter months and enjoy the sun as much as we can. It seems in northern Minnesota, boating and drinking go hand in hand.

While there is nothing wrong with having a drink or two while enjoying the lakes and all they have to offer, recent changes in the laws state that boating under the influence now carries the same consequence as a DWI. There have been many boating accidents involving alcohol that result in the loss of life, and our community has already experienced this unfortunate consequence this summer.

The DWI law states that anyone over a .08 alcohol concentration (.04 in a commercial vehicle) and you are in control of a moving or parked vehicle, you can be arrested for DWI. Consequences for being convicted of a DWI can range from fines, no-drink supervised probation, ignition interlock, jail time, etc. With the extension of these laws to boating, ignition interlock may be required on your vehicle regardless of whether or not you received a DWI in a boat. Ignition Interlock is a device that is placed in any vehicle that you drive and requires you to provide a breath sample before it will allow you to start your vehicle and continue to provide a sample at different intervals. The monthly cost of Interlock is between \$90-\$120, plus installation.

As you're catching your limit on walleye, tubing, BBQing off the back of your boat, etc., have a great time, and remember; always have a sober driver that can operate your boat/vehicles! The consequences, whether it be fines, jail time etc., to the loss of life, is too great to take a chance. Enjoy the sun and stay safe!

- 2) **Kitchen Supplies:** Pots and pans, baking sheet, dishes and utensils
- 3) **Laundry Supplies:** Sturdy laundry baskets/bags, laundry detergent, bleach, dryer sheets
- 4) **Health and hygiene:** Family-sized shampoo, hair conditioner, bath soap, lotion, toothpaste & toothbrushes

For Personal Hygiene for Shelter Guests

New men's underwear in all sizes (boxers preferred); new women's underwear, sizes 5, 6, and 7; new or gently used bras all sizes; White crew socks for adult men and women; Cough drops, reading glasses, denture adhesive and cleaning tablets; feminine hygiene products; flip flops in various sizes for shower shoes
