MINISTER'S MESSAGE FROM DAVE'S DESK

What do we mean or what is the definition of GRACE? We hear it used in church settings and in scripture, but it often sounds like something that only God can grant. I had a mentoring Pastor during my years of school while I was preparing to enter the ministry. It seemed that no matter how often I used the word GRACE and tried to apply it to my message, I knew I would hear, "Where's the Grace?" It always reminded me of the old Wendy's commercial with the little elderly woman asking, "Where's the beef." Grace is simply something we don't deserve but we receive it anyway as a gift. Some may accept that when we're talking about God dying on a cross, but how does it apply to daily life? I'll share a story to help understand.

One icy winter afternoon when Ashley was in high school, a carload of teenage boys was on their way to a basketball game. Ashley was a cheerleader and had already arrived at the game along with most of the other basketball players and cheerleaders who rode in the bus. But these four junior varsity boys chose to carpool together rather than taking the bus. They never made it to the game. On the way, a garbage truck slid through an intersection on a patch of black ice and broadsided the boy's car. One suffered a broken arm; another was in a coma for a week. And one boy was killed instantly.

The garbage truck driver wasn't injured. He wasn't the devil, just a guy trying to do his job. Maybe he was driving a little too fast. But in the blink of an eye, he had the injuries of 3 young men and the death of another on his hands and in his heart. I can only imagine the pain he lived with.

Not long after the funeral, the young boy's parents called the man responsible for killing their son and

wanted to meet him. I'm sure he had no desire to look these parents in the eye but decided to go anyways. His hand trembled as he knocked on the door. What would he see in their eyes? Hatred? Anger? Worst of all, pain?

But when the door opened, he saw nothing but compassion. They hugged him and welcomed him into their home. They served him dinner and with tears in their eyes, the parents assured this garbage truck driver, he was forgiven.

Put into this same situation, is this how we would react? It was only by the Grace of this young man's parents that this garbage truck driver was forgiven and finally had peace in his heart. Grace was the gift given, even though he didn't feel he deserved it. Sound familiar? Jesus died in a cross that our sins may be forgiven, even though we didn't deserve it. What a gift!!! Now let us all share this free gift and experience the peace you will feel in your heart.
